Samuel4 Flack (John3, Samuel2, Cotton1) was born at Boston between 1694 and 1699, and died after 1739, perhaps at Marblehead, Mass. He married at Marblehead, 11 Mar. 1719/20, Mary Stanford, baptized there 22 Feb. 1707/8, daughter of Thomas and Mary (Fluent) Stanford. On 10 May 1722, Samuel Flack of Marblehead, mason, and wife Mary sold to John Clarke all my right to two thirds of one half part of land formerly the estate of my grandfather Samuel Flack of Boston, deceased [Suffolk Deeds, 37:54]. In 1728 Samuel Flack of Marblehead, mason, was sued for debt by Joshua Ward of Salem, and in 1729 by Joseph Spear of Hull, mariner (Court Records at Boston, #22805, 22904]. 
